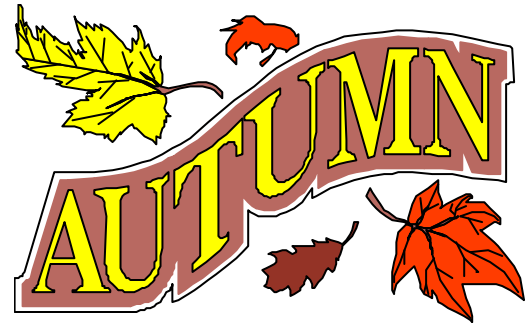

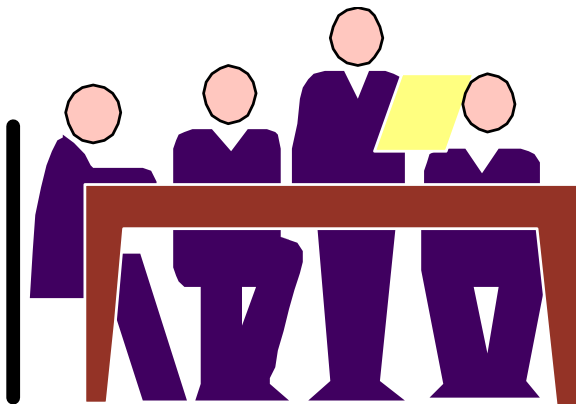

FALL NEWSLETTER MESSAGE FROM THE MANAGER

Hello Members! I am pleased to report that our operations this year were once again very successful despite poor weather nearly all Summer. We continued to sell new memberships and to grow financially. Our finances are on track and we were able to complete all of our planned projects. We have already commenced work on our 2012 Capital projects.

The remaining sites on Deer Street have been renovated and now there are dual services on all those sites. We built two additional sites on Deer as well. Next Spring we will gravel and level other sites within the Resort.

The County of Clearwater is expecting to complete the construction of the new regional sewage lagoon next year. This will certainly reduce our sewage haul expense and will eliminate the need for sewage assessments.

I would like to thank all of our Staff and Volunteers who did such a wonderful job all Summer. Your efforts are greatly appreciated and I hope to see many of you back next season.

We had many new Members join the Wilderness Village family this past season and I would like to welcome them all to the Resort.

The Winter ATV route in and out of the Resort will be open again this year. Please ride on the road only and not in our neighbor's ditches or on their driveway approaches. Care must be taken to adhere to approved trails in order to maintain this privilege.

Just a reminder to Members- No family Members other than dependent children under 21 years may use your membership or gate card with the exception of children under 24 who are dependent and attending a post secondary education facility. All others are considered non-Members.

Later in this Newsletter, you will find notices, updates and information concerning our rules and policies. I would encourage all Members to review this information to enhance your camping experience next year and to avoid any misunderstandings.

Beginning this Fall, a new custodial couple will be occupying the residence at the front of the Resort. They will monitor the gate intercom for emergency calls after regular business hours.

Member Concern forms are available anytime from the office. All concerns are addressed and replied to in a timely manner. I can be contacted by calling, visiting the office or by Email throughout the Winter.

Any Member who is interested in working at Wilderness Village next year is urged to contact me early in the season. Stay safe and we'll see you all back here again next year!

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE 23rd ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF SHAREHOLDERS

On September 3rd, 2011 the 23rd Annual General Meeting of Wilderness Village Shareholders was held. Following are some of the highlights of the business that was approved:

APPROVED OPERATING BUDGET:

1. Shareholders dues will be \$625.00 plus GST.
2. Non-Shareholders will pay \$1,200 plus GST
3. The special sewage assessment for 2012 will be \$100.00 less than last year (\$250.00 plus GST).
4. We now must charge an Alberta Tourism Tax of 4% on Cabins however our base Cabin prices will remain at \$105, \$145 and \$160 respectively for the bachelor, one bedroom and two bedroom cabins (during the peak season- June 15 through September 15). Cabin 11 (deluxe two bedroom) will cost \$175 per night during this period. Tows, dumps and plow services will remain at \$20 and \$25 for shareholders and non-shareholders respectively.
5. Member's Guests occupying their own sites still pay \$45.00 per night plus GST. If the Guest shares a site with a Member, it remains at \$30 per night plus GST. The public will continue to pay \$52 per night plus GST.
6. Five (5) new memberships are budgeted to be sold during 2012 at an initial cost offering of \$26,900 each plus GST.
7. 40 Adopt-a-sites will be available at \$1,700 each plus GST.
8. Five season passes will be sold at \$3,800 each plus GST.
9. The operating budget provides for \$210,000.00 net income before amortization.

APPROVED CAPITAL BUDGET

1. Lodge Kitchen & Lounge floor replacements \$23,200.00
2. Site Inventory and Maintenance \$35,000.00
3. Buyout of 2007 Dodge Truck Lease \$11,800.00
4. Replacement of Large Pool Steps \$10,000.00
5. Replacement of Auto-Chlorinator \$5,000.00

OTHER INFORMATION AND UPDATES

The approved 2012 sewage special assessment of \$250.00 plus GST will be due on May 1, 2012. An invoice will be sent out to Members in the Spring Newsletter by the beginning of April. Members can make arrangements ahead of time to have this debited to their on file credit card number by contacting the office.

Transfers will be capped at 40 for 2011. That number will be the same for 2012. No transfers will be processed during the peak season (June 15 through September 15).

Two or more RV occupancy will be mandatory on specially constructed and designated large sites during the peak season. These sites will be visibly identified. Members wishing to occupy one of these sites prior to the arrival of their guest, must pay the regular guest fee.

The Resort has an official "Peak Season" period (June 15 through September 15). The remainder of the year will be referred to as "Off Season". Certain policies apply to the "Peak Season" period. The Minute Books of the Association are kept at the office and are available for review by

Members during regular business hours. These books contain the Minutes of all Board and Annual General Meetings and may not be removed from the office.

NOTE: All Members must have a completed Credit Card consent form on file to charge payments for transactions taken over the phone or by Email.

CABIN RENTAL RESERVATIONS AND REUNION SITE POLICIES

CABIN RENTALS: Each year we receive a tremendous number of requests for Summer Cabin rental reservations. In order to provide an equal opportunity to all Members to make reservations and to make it fair for everyone, we will only accept bookings on a first come, first served basis after the new year, employing the following procedures:

1. No reservations are accepted until the first business day of the same year as the reservation in the New Year. ***Only Member reservations will be accepted in January. We will not accept reservations from the public until February.***
2. Our office opens for business at 8 AM, at which time our staff retrieve phone messages, review our Email and check the FAX machine, however our priority is to answer our phone, then to check other forms of communication as time allows.
3. Voice mail, Email and FAXes sent prior to office hours, will be addressed in between phone calls and will not constitute a reservation until our staff calls to take the reservation.
4. As we only have a limited number of cabins and hundreds of Members, sometimes we cannot accommodate all requests.
5. All Cabin reservations are booked through our reservation receptionist in order to prevent double bookings. It is advisable to remain on hold until they can take your call, as they are addressed in the order they are received.
6. PLEASE NOTE: FROM JUNE 15 THROUGH TO SEPTEMBER 15 Cabin reservation cancellations must be received THIRTY (30) days in advance in order to receive a deposit refund. This action will greatly reduce lost revenue caused by empty cabins that could have been rented to others.

REUNION PROCEDURES:

1. All reunion sites will be paid for in full, at the time of booking by the sponsoring Member in order to confirm the reservation of reunion sites. A \$50.00 (plus GST) non-refundable administration fee will apply.
2. Cancellations will be refunded in full, provided that they are received a minimum of one month before the scheduled reunion event.
3. The sponsoring Member will be required to provide a list of all reunion guests to the office in a timely manner, prior to their guest's arrival and will be responsible to ensure that their guests comply with the Resort rules and regulations.

NOTICE TO MEMBERS

Any secondary unit (units other than a Member's primary RV unit) must be stored in the secondary compound (fee applies) or removed from Wilderness Village property after each visit.

- All equipment (including ATV'S) stored on Wilderness Village property must have appropriate membership numbers displayed clearly. (Refer to Member's Handbook).
- No secondary units may be stored in the RV Storage Compound.
- Storage in the Secondary Compound is subject to a fee and availability.
- Requests to borrow basic tools will now be addressed through the office only.
- **The access road to the RV and Secondary Storage Compounds are closed during the Winter. They are not plowed.**

INFORMATION FOR WINTER CAMPERS

Immediately after the September long weekend, we reduce our Staff. They work from 8 AM to 4 PM, Monday through Saturday. ***On Sundays*** the Office is closed, but one Maintenance person and the Housekeeper are on site from 8 AM to 4 PM. Contact can be made with the Maintenance Department via the Gate Phone at the Resort entrance between 8 AM and 4 PM only. ***There are no Staff on duty after 4 PM, therefore Members are required to be self reliant after hours.***

The Gate radio is monitored after 4 PM ***for emergency situations only, therefore Members are required to take care of their own guests between the hours of 4 PM and 8 AM the following day.*** Please don't have your guests call at night for access into the Resort. ***This is a Member's responsibility during the off season.***

Members will need to have their Gate Cards with them at all times, in order to access the Resort between 4 PM and 8 AM the following day.

There are no office Staff working after 4 PM from September 15 until June 15. **The business office is open Monday through Saturday from 8 AM to 4 PM- closed for lunch between 12 and 1 PM.**

RULES FOR WINTER CAMPING

1. Have your Gate Card with you.
2. All RV units must have Membership Numbers displayed.
3. Only overnight stays count towards next year's site allocation. (Cabin nights count too).
4. Winter camping officially starts on **October 2**. Members have up to two weeks to place their units on site and must inform the Office regarding any delays. A Member may place their unit on their assigned Winter site (should it be available) up to a maximum of two weeks before Winter camping begins. They must then occupy their unit until Winter Camping formally begins. Member's Handbook Rules apply. All RV units must be BACKED on to the site.
5. Winter camping ends on **May 1**. A financial penalty will be assessed towards any Member who leaves their RV unit behind on site after the end of Winter Camping.
6. **A daily sign up sheet for Winter Camping is located at the Lodge by the front door. Members are required to register each day that they stay overnight in the Resort.** Days camped within the true Winter camping season (December 21 to March 21) are used to determine seniority and eligibility for the following year's allocation. Members must self-register for all nights camped from October through May, as this information is also used as the following year's site allocation criteria.
7. All electrical cords must be unplugged when a Member is not occupying their unit. **Members are advised to know the whereabouts of the breaker panel for their site. There are no maintenance staff on duty at night- so Members will need to reset their own tripped breakers! A breaker location manual will be at the Lodge near the registration book.**

WINTER CAMPING SERVICES

Site Plowing- While the main roads throughout the Resort are plowed on a regular basis, individual sites are not. Members must call by **4 PM the day before** such services are required, during business hours. Sites that have not been plowed all Winter, may not be able to be plowed later in the season if there has been significant melting and freezing. There is a fee for snow plowing. Please note: There are no staff working after 4 PM.

Propane Filling- Propane is filled only once per day (between 1 and 2 PM). Members are to stop at the Office and pay for the propane, then drop the tank off at the refill station (beside the maintenance department). On Sundays the Office is closed. Call the Maintenance Department on the gate phone between 1 and 2 PM only, for propane filling. During cold weather, check your propane level often.

Emergencies- Should an emergency situation occur after business hours use the Gate intercom at the front entrance to the Resort (located on either side of the Gate House). If medical assistance is required, please call **911** and meet them at the front gate (use gate card). To have an after hours emergency message delivered to someone staying in the Resort, call the RCMP at **(403) 845-2881** and they will contact the custodian at his residence.

Should your power go out and you are unable to locate the breaker panel for your site, run out of propane or have the furnace quit, the Lodge is open 24 hours per day for your convenience. There are several RV repair companies in Rocky Mountain House who provide mobile service if your furnace requires service. **Our Staff are not permitted to repair RV's or plug in unattended units.**

OTHER

- 1. The RV Storage and Secondary Storage Compounds are not plowed during the Winter.** The access roads to these areas are closed. Members who require access to their units in order to head South for the Winter, but who are not registered for Winter camping, must make arrangements with the management prior to commencement of the Winter Camping season. These units will be placed on an accessible site within the Resort, but may not be used for Winter Camping. Members who do not Winter camp but come out early in the season to camp, should be reminded that **we do not offer trailer towing services from after Thanksgiving to the end of April.** The Resort will not be responsible to plow an access route to the Storage Compound or to maintain an area for Members to regularly access their units in the Winter, other than for assigned Winter sites.
- 2. Due to liability concerns, our Staff are not permitted to sweep snow off RV units, or to plug in unattended RV units.**
- 3. No ATV's are permitted to operate within the Resort except from designated staging areas or along pre-approved access routes.** Please check with the Office for approved access routes in and out of the Resort. **ATV enthusiasts are required to choose Winter sites near these routes (South end of the Resort), or trailer their ATV's to the staging area next to the Maintenance Shop. Please note: During the Winter camping season, the former ATV staging area (next to the Maintenance Shop) will be available for staging ATV's.** Willow Way is a designated Winter ATV route west to Hemlock Crescent and out of the Resort. **Please remember that all machines must operate at idle speed while in the Resort and that they are not to be used as transportation from site to site or to our facilities. ATV's are to travel directly in and out of the Resort and are not to be used for recreational purposes while in the Resort.**
- 4. All motorized vehicles operated on the Resort property must carry liability insurance. This includes trucks, motor homes, passenger vehicles, ATV's, golf carts, scooters, etc.**
- 5. All applications for Winter Camping were to be received by 4 PM, August 6th. Late applicants may be accepted subject to the Member paying a \$200 plus GST fee and to availability (up to a maximum of 185 sites).**
- 6. Share the Lodge with other Members. Parents, please remember that children must act responsibly while in the Lodge. The Hot Tubs are not to be monopolized by young children and the courtesy of usage must be shared with adults. Resort policy prohibits children**

under the age of 8 from using the Hot Tubs. Parents are also required to supervise anyone under 16 in the Hot Tubs.

7. Our Housekeeping Staff is reduced to one person during the Winter months. Members are asked to mop up after themselves in the shower rooms and to ensure that toilets are flushed.

8. **DEPOSIT ALL GARBAGE IN THE GREEN STEEL BINS BY THE RESORT EXIT GATE.** They have been placed there so that Members can conveniently dispose of their garbage when leaving the Resort. The waste disposal truck cannot manoeuvre inside the Resort during the Winter, so all other bins are stored for the season. ***PLEASE USE ONLY THE LARGE GREEN BINS LOCATED AT THE RESORT ENTRANCE. DO NOT DROP OFF YOUR GARBAGE IN THE WASHROOMS. Garbage left outside will attract animals.***

9. **No cords, lights, ropes or cables may be attached to trees.**

10. All tents and picnic shelters may be placed only on the site pads and not on the grass. The same policy applies to all camping units, motor vehicles and utility trailers. **ALL UNITS MUST BE BACKED ON TO SITES.**

11. **NOTICE: WINTER CAMPING:** A cap on the total number of Winter sites designated to the program has been implemented in order to maintain a manageable and reasonable sized grid within the most accessible areas of the Resort. Sites will be limited to a maximum of **185** in total. Winter campers who register for Winter Camping but who do not camp a minimum of **nine nights** (including cabin rental nights) between October 2 and May 1 of the Winter Camping season **AND** who do not camp at least **one night** during the actual Winter camping season (between December 21 and March 21), **will not qualify for the following year's program, however Members who do not qualify and those who are late applicants** (applying after the Monday of the August long weekend) **MAY** be allowed in to the program providing that the total number of designated sites will not be exceeded (185) and that a fee is received in the amount of \$200.00 plus GST.

3 YEAR SITE PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS PLEASE NOTE:

Those Members whose 3 year sites are not within the Winter camping grid, must register for a Winter site within the actual grid before the registration deadline each year if they wish to Winter camp. Nightly registration is required at the Lodge during the Winter months.

NOTICE TO MEMBERS

MEMBERSHIP UPGRADE OPTION

The Board of Directors has developed an option for Members wishing to extend their term of membership for their lifetime. These options are outlined below:

SHAREHOLDER MEMBERSHIP UPGRADE

Only current shareholders in good standing with twenty (20) years or less of term remaining on their membership may purchase an additional lifetime term for 50% of the current price of the membership portion of a Shareholding membership at the time. The term of membership would then become one lifetime plus the actual remaining years of membership term. For example: A Shareholder having fifteen years of membership term remaining would pay 50% of the current membership price (currently \$12,450 plus GST) and that would upgrade their membership to one lifetime plus fifteen years. Should the Member sell then their membership, the lifetime portion will be removed from the membership and the fifteen (15) years of term remaining would then take effect.

NON-SHAREHOLDER MEMBERSHIP UPGRADE

Only current non-Shareholders in good standing with twenty (20) years or less of term remaining on their membership may purchase an additional lifetime term for 50% of the current price of membership at the time. Non-Shareholding Members must also purchase a share at the same time (par value of \$2,000) to become Shareholders.

The term of membership would then become one lifetime plus the actual remaining years of membership term. For example: A non-Shareholder having fifteen years of membership term remaining would pay 50% of the current membership price plus the share (membership price currently is \$12,450 plus GST plus \$2,000 for the share) and that would upgrade their membership to one lifetime plus fifteen years with shareholding privileges. Should that Member then sell their membership, the lifetime portion will be removed from the membership and the fifteen (15) years of term remaining would then take effect.

SEASONAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES

We will once again be looking for seasonal staff next year in various departments. If you are interested in applying for a seasonal position or would like additional information, please contact the office by next March. The Resort will provide complimentary moving and sewer services for seasonal staff members.

Persons will be hired according to their qualifications and experience. Job descriptions are available.

PAID SEASONAL POSITIONS:

STORE MANAGER(S)

We will be looking for a new Store Manager for the 2012 season. Previous retail experience is preferred. Contact Resort Manager for more details.

STORE STAFF

Duties: Operating a till, customer service, food preparation, etc. All training is provided.

HOUSEKEEPING

Duties: Janitorial tasks include washroom cleaning and cabin housekeeping. Daytime and evening shifts are available. Complete training and orientation is provided.

MAINTENANCE

Some of the maintenance duties may include:

- Trailer towing
- Pool and general maintenance
- Vacuum unit operation

Preference will be given to those persons possessing mechanical aptitude and experience.

OFFICE REGISTRATION

Duties: Updating our site inventory, completing registration forms and office reception. Preference will be given to mature people who are available to work from June through to mid-September. Applicants must possess a professional, customer service-oriented attitude and be computer literate.

SECURITY

Duties: Checking site inventory, addressing violations, maintaining good public relations. A

professional, friendly attitude is required. Our Security department will be composed of three people. Some weekend shifts are required. Complete orientation will be provided.

RECREATION

Duties: Organizing and participating in safe, fun activities for campers of all ages. Applicants must be mature and professional. Preference will be given to those who are able to commence their duties in mid-June and continue until the end of the September long weekend. All applicants must possess recreational qualifications or related experience.

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

Wilderness Village prides itself on the sense of community and volunteerism provided by its Members. Some volunteer duties require a significant commitment on behalf of a Member, therefore towing and honey run fees will be waived during the term of their commitment. CHAPEL IN THE WOODS- SUMMER SUNDAY SERVICES

This past year, the Rocky Ministerial has had a difficult time accommodating our requests for persons to lead seasonal Chapel services at Wilderness Village. Some of our Members have come forward to organize a committee to look after this important service. If you would like to join this committee, please contact Ron Webster, Resort Manager. NOTICE REGARDING PARKING IN THE RESORT

Members have expressed concerns regarding vehicles parking along roadways. This creates a hazard for pedestrians and other vehicles. No vehicles are to park along roadways in front of campsites. Please park all extra vehicles in the designated areas provided including: Behind the Lodge, beside Cabin 1, behind the new washroom, beside the South Comfort Station, the lot in Tee Pee Trail, the lot beside the BMX track, across from the Blueberry Comfort Station, across from the Office and the lot by the front entrance. Thank you.



ADOPT-A-SITE PROGRAM 2012- Program Rules & Guidelines

1. Applications may be sent by mail, FAX or in person. A cheque or Credit Card number must be presented at the time of application (\$1,785 including GST). Members who apply but whose names are not drawn, will not have their cheque cashed or Credit Card debited .
2. All participants are required to keep their sites neat and tidy. Lawn mowing may be necessary. Portable structures such as tents and dining shelters must be moved regularly to prevent killing the grass. Nothing may be tied to the trees.
3. Members who participated last year are not automatically guaranteed an Adopt-a-Site for 2012. The selection process will be fair to all participants and performed by drawing a number of names equal to the number of sites allocated to the program. **There will be 40 sites allocated to the 2012 program.**
4. **Applications may be submitted anytime prior to the deadline, which will be 4 PM Friday, February 24, 2012. The draw date will be Saturday, February 25, 2012.**
5. Applicants may choose up to **40** sites in the descending order of their choice. Sites will be assigned to Members according to their preference in the order they are drawn, providing it was not chosen by a Member whose name was previously drawn. That being the case, the available choice on their list will then be assigned, providing that no more than fifty percent of the sites on any one particular street will be occupied as Adopt-a-Sites. Members are advised to complete all **40** of their choices on the application form to ensure that they will be awarded a site.
6. **Beginning this year, a Member may share an Adopt-a-site with another Member providing the second Member pays an additional fee equal to 60% of the regular Adopt-a-site fee. The first Member on that site will be deemed the primary Adopt-a-site program occupant. That Member must ensure that the size of the site is adequate for two units.**
7. Shareholding Members will have the first opportunity to participate in this program. Should all **40** sites not be taken after the initial Shareholder's draw, non-Shareholding Members applications will be drawn until all sites for the program are taken. A waiting list will be compiled based on the order in which they were drawn (in the event of a cancellation).
8. The Program duration extends from May 2 through to and including October 1. At the conclusion of the Program all RV units must be immediately removed from the site. Participants wishing to Winter Camp will be required to register in the usual manner and **will not** be assigned the same site as their Adopt-a-Site.
9. An umpire will be appointed by the Board to oversee the Adopt-a-Site Program. All WVCA rules and regulations will still apply, although they will be subject to the interpretation and determination of the Manager, who will address any issues involving site usage. The 24 and 72 hour site absentee rule will not apply to participants. Members are reminded that according to our rules, only one primary RV unit and one tent are permitted on a site, with the tent having to be moved frequently to avoid damaging the grass. The maximum number of persons permitted to camp on the site is eight (as per WVCA rules).
10. Adopt-a-Sites are intended for participating Member's use only. No guest may occupy the site without the Member present unless prior approval is received from the Resort management (additional camping fee will apply).
11. PLEASE NOTE: Sites which were used in the program during 2011 and any other sites that are NOT part of the 2012 Adopt-a-Site Program have been excluded from the eligible sites list.
12. No two Adopt-a-Sites will be assigned directly beside each other nor will a site be assigned directly beside a Three Year Site.
